

18MN15694 – Theft of Purse

On Sunday June 10, 2018 at approximately 3:40 pm, a 49-year-old Manalapan resident reported that an unknown subject(s) entered her garage on Bailey Court sometime between 12:00 pm Friday June 8, 2018 and 9:00 am Saturday June 9, 2018 and removed her purse.
