21MN24832 – Fraud

On Tuesday, November 30, 2021, at 3:55 p.m., a 68-year-old Manalapan resident responded to Manalapan Township Police Headquarters and reported that an unknown actor opened a fraudulent cell phone account in the victim's name. No monetary loss was reported as a result of this incident. Patrolman Everett McNulty handled the report.
